

CURRICULUM POLICY

Whyalla Special Education Centre seeks to provide a safe and secure environment for all students and staff.

Curriculum describes the core knowledge, understanding, skills and capabilities students should learn as they progress through school. Teachers use curriculum to plan student learning, monitor and assess student progress, report student progress to families and support student wellbeing.

At Whyalla Special Education Centre, staff prepare and deliver a rigorous, differentiated curriculum with a key focus on fostering independence.

The Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Standards guide our work; students with disability have the same rights as other students, including the right to education and training 'on the same basis' as students without disabilities.

Australian Curriculum

It is implemented across all classes, to all students.

Teachers use F-10 curriculum to plan, monitor, assess and report on student learning in the following learning areas: English

Teaching for Effective Learning Framework (TfEL)

It is used to develop quality teaching and learning environments

Teachers use the General Capabilities (AC)

It is used to support access to and progress through the learning areas. Through a focus on the general capabilities of Literacy, Numeracy, Personal and Social, Ethical Understanding, ICT, students with disability can access teaching and learning programs drawn from age equivalent learning area content that is relevant to their individual learning needs. **Information available through the Australian Curriculum website**

South Australian Certificate Education (modified subjects) is delivered to students Year 10 – 13. Students in Year 10 are enrolled in SACE, (modified Personal Learning Plan). Students in Year 11 complete 3 modified SACE Stage 1 subjects.

Students in Year 12 complete SACE Stage 1 requirements and 2 Stage 2 modified subjects
Students in Year 13 complete SACE Stage 2 requirements and modified Research Project

All students have a **Negotiated Education Plan**. The plan is developed or reviewed during term 1 of each year with current reports, plans, information used to complete the document. An agreed mode of communication for each student is stated in their NEP.

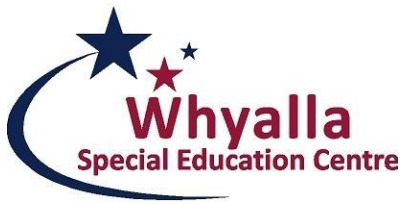

Interactive White Boards: All classrooms are fitted with this technology and is used to support group instruction, differentiation and engagement.
